

Kushana Bush was born in 1983 in Dunedin, New Zealand where she continues to live and work. Since the mid 2000's she has won numerous residencies and awards including the University of Otago Frances Hodgkins Fellowship in 2011 and New Zealand Arts Foundation New Generation Award in 2013. Bush has regularly exhibited throughout Australasia and internationally. Her major solo exhibition and publication 'The Burning Hours' was toured by Dunedin Public Art Gallery throughout New Zealand from 2016-17. Her work is held in public collections throughout New Zealand and Australia, including the Art Gallery of New South Wales, the National Gallery of Victoria, Monash University Museum of Art Collection, Buxton Contemporary Melbourne and Queensland Art Gallery of Modern Art, Brisbane.

Bush's gouaches take us to that moment of suspension in everyday life when something half enters the world, putting our picture of the world to the test. She belongs to contemporary New Zealand art ... but also looks to the illuminated books of the Middle Ages and to Persian and Mughal miniatures. That is, she is forever pointing forwards to an afterwards... Never merely antiquarian, Bush takes her viewers to where myths are still happening in a timeless present.

Like our dreams, we experience images that arrive from elsewhere, intriguing or elating us, asking us to understand where they may have come from. Bush's images are out-of-the-ordinary, but, as in our dreams, their out-of-the-ordinariness is modelled on and anchored in the contemporary everyday... Images from different eras and aesthetic persuasions overlap, mingle, and collide. In this way, Bush's work speaks to the persistence of ancient mythology within modern secular society



Louise Weaver was born in Mansfield, Victoria, Australia in 1966, and currently lives and works in Melbourne, Australia. She has exhibited widely in Australia and Internationally. Her recent survey exhibition *Between Appearances: The art of Louise Weaver*, was curated by Melissa Keys at Buxton Contemporary, Melbourne, (2019-2020).

Louise uses a diverse range of genres and media in her work, her deep engagement and experimentation with a variety of materials, has resulted in a practice that includes sculpture, painting, drawing, collage, prints, and photography to moving image, sound, and installation. Her most recent paintings and sculptures are absorbed by the dynamics and fragility of the natural world, environmental, social, and feminist concerns. Her paintings, such as *Nature study (Fathom)* 2021, *Nature study (Looks like rain)* 2021 and *Nature study (Lotus)* 2021, operate as both landscapes and abstractions, with their orchestration of colour, texture, and pictorial structures they explore the possibilities of paint, through order and coincidence, layers and floods, shades, and facings. Emerging from a fascination with metamorphosis, cycles of growth and the intricacies of camouflage, the use of crochet to create coverings over animals and organic forms has been present in Weaver's work since the early 1990s; *Some day I'll fly away* 2021, *I will come to you (Red bird)* 2021 and *The skin of dreams (Citron)* 2021 suggest fantastical worlds and dream-like imaginings just out of view. *Memory walks behind us* 2021, is an object that also has the appearance of furniture, with a network of woven cotton and lanyard of eggs, suggesting an esoteric, symbolic function yet to be revealed.

'In Weaver's allusive world, poetry and meaning take form in the complex spaces between appearances, in the seemingly endless interchange between gestures, ideas and feeling. Highly propositional, her works are imaginative and exquisite objects, tableaux, constellations, and fields for contemplation. Through the intricate traceries, patterns, webs, and nets that appear and reappear throughout her practice, Weaver suggests a complex interconnected universe of fragile beauty that comprises things real and imagined, fleeting and eternal.'












